Melissa and Shaelynn said the counselors were very helpful in pushing them to make friends and make the best of the RYLA weekend opportunity. They also showed pictures of their exercise in breaking a block of wood with their bare hands. Melissa was successful; some were not but it was agreed it was a cool experience. Melissa and Shaelynn said one of the sessions involved being divided in small groups and discussing how to deal with subjects such as abuse in a negative home environment, peer pressure and bullying. Melissa and Shaelynn said they did a presentation on depression and youth in Alberta which was presented to all the Rotarians present. The members of the RC of High River were so impressed they contributed a donation of \$2,500. Shaelynn said she met a girl over the RYLA weekend who was blinded during an assault who presented herself very well in appearance and manner. At the end of a presentation she made to the group the blind girl asked that the lights to be turned off in the room and then told everyone that this is what she sees when she wakes up in the morning. The one day of the RYLA weekend was called WII Day. The activity that our guest speakers said they enjoyed on WII day was joining in on the WII games and also watching some very athletic young males do their WII thing. Lots of friends were reported to be made over the whole weekend and Melissa and Shaelynn said they still keep in touch with a lot of their new acquaintances from the weekend. Melissa and Shaelynn finished their talk by giving a big thank you to the RC of Innisfail for sponsoring them for the life-changing RYLA weekend. At the end they showed a group picture of the 100 or so students who attended RYLA and the members spent some time playing "Where's Waldo" by trying to locate Melissa and Shaelynn.
