

Beginning in 1918 the Rotary Club in Lethbridge has worked to help the

community. The first major project was to create a beach on the shores of Henderson Lake 1926. Though the Lake has not been used for swimming since the late 1950s the steps from the beach can still be seen today. Henderson Park continues to be a popular recreational area for Lethbridge residents.

Tonight's events is a combined effort by all three Rotary Clubs. It is the intention of the Sunrise Club, just recently chartered to carry on from Rotary's first projects and keep Henderson Lake an active and vibrant place for community activity.

They started this dream by rigorous training at Henderson Lake.

Every Wednesday and Saturday, in all kinds of weather, Abreast of 'bridge can be seen training in a voyager canoe at the lake. This training was rewarded when last July, the team took first in the Alberta Women's Consolation Final, with a time of 4 minutes and 9 seconds and the Sliver medal in the Breast Cancer Foundation Challenge Cup.

To continue to fulfill their dream, the team needed to have their own Dragon Boats to enable them to train and participate in hosting a festival in Lethbridge. Tonight will complete Abreast of 'bridge's dream.
