

- Age: 15–19
- A full academic year
- Large admin component for YEX
- Subject to certification requirements

New Generations Service Exchange (NGSE)

- 2013
- Age: 18–30
- SERVICE ELEMENT
- Up to 6 months
- Not subject to YEX certification
- Customizable program for University students and Professionals.

- Membership engagement





Examples of NGSE in Action

Vocational Tour (Group)

• Group performing multiple activities around a certain profession (law, tech, engineering, etc.)

<u>Unpaid Internship / Apprenticeship (Individual)</u>

Focused on an individuals profession or area of study

Service Project Teams (Group / Individual)

 Group of young adults interested in a particular area of focus (water, education, maternal health etc.)
