


#### What is "Inter-Generational Trauma"?

Two books that have improved my understanding of Inter-Generational Trauma are:

### Five Little Indians by Michelle Good (2020)

"Taken from their families as small children and confined at a remote, Church run residential school, Kenny, Lucy, Clara, Howie and Maisie are barely out of childhood when they are finally released, with no money or support, after years of detention."





A Knock on the Door – The Essential History of Residential Schools from the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada (2016)

"It can start with a knock on the door one morning. It is the local Indian Agent, or the Parish Priest, or perhaps a Mounted Police Officer. The officials have arrived and the children must go. So begin the school experience of many Indigenous children in Canada for more than 100 years, and so begins the history of residential schools prepared by the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada"

David Newman submitted the following information:

I was Minister for Northern Affairs and responsible for Native Affairs, May 29, 1997.

My role as Minister responsible for the Native Affairs Secretariat was to lead the Province of Manitoba part of finalizing, signing and beginning the implementation of the Treaty Land Entitlement Agreement. Negotiations had been ongoing for years before I became Minister of Northern Affairs and Minister responsible for Native Affairs, in January of 1997.

When I spoke at the signing ceremony in The Pas May 29, 1997 I communicated my opinion that the signing of this agreement can be the beginning of the restoration of the opportunity and capacities of the party First Nations to once again become the preeminent peoples in the province.

#### "Thank You" for the Books sent to the Manto Sipi Cree Nation School:

1483 books were sent by Share the Magic, our partner organization. We arranged the shipping of the books.

#### From the Principal:

"I am writing to THANK YOU all, for your many wonderful gifts to our children, therefore also to their families. I was wonderful to receive your high quality and large number of books, appropriate for all

ages. My wife and I laid them out on HOMEC classroom tables in an organized fashion. Each table having its appropriate Grade level books. There was such a great variety! I know the teachers and students couldn't believe their eyes!!! We had the student go through the room, choosing their own books, three or four different days.

Your beautiful assortment of books were so exciting to all age levels. The books were selected with care, according to individual interest and reading level. The children were



surprised that they were "for keeps". So they took them home and read and re-read their books. You packed them in such a well-organized manner. We could see that they were packed, in love."

#### From the students:

"The books really train my mind and encourage me because we hardly have any good books to read in our Library."

"I am 5 years old. My best book is the hockey one. Thanks for all my books. I brought them home on the bus."

"Those books are the best. I enjoyed reading them. I want to have more books. A Big thank you to everyone."





# YOUTH PROGRAMS:

### The 2022 Rotary Winnipeg Model United Nations Assembly (MUNA)

The 2022 Rotary Winnipeg Model United Nations Assembly (MUNA) took place virtually on April 28–29 with 120 students participating from across Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Ontario, British Columbia and North Dakota. The Rotary Club of Winnipeg has been hosting MUNA through in-person and virtual formats since 1957 with alumni going on to serve the public in roles including Premier, Grand Chief, and Foreign Affairs Minister. This year, students drafted and debated two important and timely resolutions, including: (1) A framework for regulating social networking companies regarding data storage, usage, transparency, and terms of use to safeguard democracy; and (2) Building a post-Covid-19 circular world economy for mitigating and enhancing resilience to future climate change.

Three student members of the Rotary MUNA organizing committee, Avinashpall Singh, Farya Farhangi Khosroshahi, and Dviya Sharma were on hand at the club's luncheon on May 18th to share their experience as both delegates and organizers. They each shared how their experience helped them understand the importance of voicing opinions and engaging in respectful debates to build consensus, while striving to approach issues from multiple perspectives.



Avinashpall and Farya are both second-year students at the University of Manitoba and will co-chair the Rotary MUNA organizing committee for 2022–23. Avinash and Farya participated in MUNA 2021 as delegates from River East Collegiate High School and Fort Richmond Collegiate, respectively, and both received honourable mentions for the Rais Khan Award for Most Diplomatic Delegation. As organizing committee members, Avinash coordinated digital outreach efforts and Farya coordinated the development of MUNA's overall thematic focus and resolution topics, among other roles.






# YOUTH PROGRAMS:
