"Kinston, NC. Flooding and Flood Relief"

In early October, 2016, in the aftermath of Hurricane Matthew, the Neuse River experienced severe flooding in Kinston, North Carolina. As a result of the flooding, the Kinston Rotarians cancelled the up-coming visit of Rotarians from their Sister Rotary Club in Winnipeg.

The Rotary Club of Kinston meets regularly at King's Restaurant which had 28 inches of water in their building, as shown in photo.

First a little background: Kay Harrell from Kinston, and Ray Van from Winnipeg, both Presidents of their Clubs, met at the 1996 Rotary International Convention in Calgary. Upon returning home, they convinced their Clubs to become Sister Rotary Clubs. Over the past 20 years, the Sister Club relationship has been nurtured and strengthened by annual visits between the Clubs.

On October 17, 2016, our Rotary Board launched the **Kinston Flood Relief Appeal** and agreed to match member donations up to \$1,000. Rotarians and former Rotarians who had visited Kinston in the past contributed a total of CAN\$1,300. The Board later agreed to match these donations in order to provide a total donation of US\$2,000 to the Rotary Club of Kinston.

The donation was finally sent to Kinston in January, 2017.

Attached are copies of several letters of appreciation for your review. Although our donation was small relative to the size of the flood recovery challenge, it appears to have touched the hearts of our Rotary friends in Kinston, NC.

Subject: Kinston Flood Relief Appeal.

Last October, following the Flooding of parts of Kinston, we launched a Kinston Flood Relief Appeal amongst our members and former Rotarians who had visited Kinston as part of our Rotary Sister Club relationship.

The Board of our Club launched the Appeal, by allocating US\$1,000 as matching funds for donations from Winnipeg Rotarians and Kinston Visit Alumni. The result is that we raised a total of US\$2,000. Half of the donations came from former Rotarians who are Kinston Alumni. I think this emphasizes how significant the Kinston visits have been to the participants.

Enclosed is a check (cheque) for US\$2,000 for the Rotary Club of Kinston to use for Flood Relief Assistance. We would like to see the funds used for services for youth who were negatively affected by the flooding. However, we leave it to your discretion to decide on the best use of the funds.

We wish you well as you continue to recover from last October's flooding. Personally, Nancy and I look forward to visiting Kinston in October 2017.



Letter to the Editor

Dear Editor,

Members of the Rotary Club of Winnipeg and the Rotary Club of Kinston (North Carolina) are unlikely friends. Kinston is 2826 km south of Winnipeg. This distance hasn't posed a difficulty to our friendship. In June 1996, Kay Harrell from Kinston and Ray Van from Winnipeg, presidents of their clubs, met at the 1996 International Rotary Convention in Calgary. Upon returning home they convinced their clubs to become Sister Rotary Clubs.

The Red River flood in April 1997, we understand, was the largest evacuation in Canadian history and the most severe flood since 1826. The Rotary Club of Kinston extended a contribution to assist our new friends, Winnipeg Rotarians, and their neighbors in distress. A few months later in October 1997, hurricane Floyd brought disaster to Eastern North Carolina, and our friends in Winnipeg sent our suffering citizens a helping hand. Now after 19 years, in October 2016, a hurricane named Matthew wreaked havoc on Kinston and our neighboring towns spreading damage we are not yet over. Once again, a helping hand came from the Rotary Club of Winnipeg to many North Carolinians in need. The kind donation from Winnipeg went towards getting families back together, providing meals for the hungry, transporting people to work, paying rent for the homeless, and for coordinating volunteers from out of town to provide skills and labor.

Our Sister Club history has not all been tragedy. During these 19 years, we have enjoyed annual visits between clubs, getting to learn how we each work and play, and what we value and what we think. We have shared ideas and projects as we strive to live our club motto, "service above self".

How fortunate we are to grow these special friendships. Thank you Rotary Club of Winnipeg for the gift and the help for our flooded citizens, and for enriching our lives with the gift of Rotary Friendship.
