She is a member of the WRHA Youth Mental Health Advisory Council, and a member of the U of W Board of Regents where she is a 2nd year Education student.

- Individuals who have contributed more than \$1000 to the Annual Program Fund, the Polio Plus Fund or the Humanitarian Grants Program of the Rotary Foundation are recognized as Paul Harris Fellows.
- Individuals may contribute \$1,000 to the Annual Program Fund etc., to honour another individual. (eg. Ernie Armitt made a \$1,000 donation to honour an individual in another province.)
- Individual Rotary clubs may from time to time honor individuals as Paul Harris
 Fellows. These honorees are individuals who meet high professional and
 personal standards set forth by Paul Harris. (eg. Cynthia Brick and a few other

members of our Club have been honoured by the Kinston Rotary Club during their Winnipeg visits.) <u>Paul Harris recognition is not limited to Rotarians</u>.

Resilience and Contagion

Invoking Human Rights in African HIV Advocacy

By Kristi Heather Kenyon

An in-depth study of why civil society advocacy groups working on HIV choose the language of rights.

HIV represents not only an unprecedented pandemic but also a site of civil society innovation. In the midst of devastation, activists in sub-Saharan Africa are progressing from traditional forms of health advocacy to strategies that engage human rights principles, techniques, and language.

Employing a comparative case-study approach, Resilience and Contagion considers the efforts of nine local civil society organizations in Ghana, Uganda, South Africa, and Botswana. Kristi Heather Kenyon examines who adopts rights-based discourse and why, arguing that leadership, individual beliefs, and structure all play a critical role in framing advocacy. Beyond changing laws or policies, the most





important impact of promoting the rights of people living with HIV, she attests, is that it enables individuals to interact with health services from a position of resilience, strength, and empowerment. This book delves into discourse at the juncture of human rights, social theory, and global health, prompting significant and relevant discussion on advocacy's evolution in the region of the world hit hardest by the HIV pandemic.

Drawing on 145 interviews, extensive participant observation, and fascinating document analysis, Resilience and Contagion foregrounds the voices of civil society actors who have conducted the most vocal, widespread, and innovative health advocacy to date.
