FOCUS ON ZIMBABWE:

My Happy Bucks for the week included the news that Robert Mugabe had resigned as President of Zimbabwe and hopefully this bring about significant positive change for the country and its people.

Winnipeg Rotarians have a long involvement with projects and people from Zimbabwe. The people include:





- Strini Reddy who spent two years (1962 63) in Zimbabwe at the beginning of his long travels to finally arrive in The Pas, Manitoba in 1971.
- **Chippo Hambira** who was a Rotary Ambassadorial Scholar hosted by the Charleswood Club, and often visited our Club.
- **Gertrude Hambira** and Family who were sponsored as a refugee family by the Charleswood and other local Rotary Clubs in Winnipeg
- Kuda Hambira has participated in the Rotary RYLA summer camp
- Ismael Muvingi was a member of our Club before moving to Florida
- **Tsungai Muvingi** was a member of the local Rotaract Club and now works with the Salvation Army
- **Dr. Mutanga**, Executive Director of the Canadian Multicultural Disability Centre in Winnipeg

The projects include:

- Support for **Hambira family** to escape persecution in Zimbabwe
- Tree of Life Community Healing Program for Youth who have experienced Organized Violence & Torture in Zimbabwe received a \$5,000 grant and was championed by Ismael Muvingi
- **Chirasauta Water Project** was championed by Dr. Mutanga and Strini Reddy, who together raised over \$25,000 for this project.

RECENTS SPEAKERS:

Topic: Menstrual Hygiene & Micro Enterprise in Uganda & Cambodia Speakers: Betty Liedtke, Tabitha Kyambadde (from Uganda), Judy from the USA, and Diana O'Malley, President of Rotary Club of Frankston Peninsula 2.0 from Australia



The three speakers from the USA, all Rotarians, spoke about their work with a project in Uganda. They talked about the problem of young girls dropping out or missing many days of school once they reach puberty and start menstruating. They drop out or miss

school because of the lack of menstrual hygiene products and the lack of privacy for proper hygiene.

The project has developed some menstrual hygiene products and is providing local women in Uganda with sewing machines to make the products and generate an income selling the products.

Diane O'Malley, a Rotary guest from Australia, is involved in a similar project in Cambodia and shared some of their experience and insights.

The major benefit from both of these projects is that young teenage girls are able to attend school on a continuous basis, and in the long run more girls are graduating from secondary school.
