NOBEL PEACE PRIZES WINNERS ANNOUNCED for 2018:

The **2018 Nobel Peace Prize** was awarded to <u>Denis Mukwege</u> and <u>Nadia</u> <u>Murad</u> "for their efforts to end the use of sexual violence as a weapon of war and armed conflict" <u>Denis Mukwege</u> is a gynecologist specializing in the treatment of women victimized by sexual violence in the Democratic Republic of the Congo, and <u>Nadia Murad</u> is a Yazidi human rights advocate who survived sexual slavery by



the Islamic State in Iraq and published a memoir of the ordeal. "Each of them in their own way has helped to give greater visibility to war-time sexual violence, so that the perpetrators can be held accountable for their actions," reads the award citation.^[1]

Darcy Ataman of "Make Music Matter" has spoken to our Club about his work with Dr Mukwege and the Panzi Hospital in the Congo. **Nafia Naso** has spoken to our Club about the plight of the Yazidis in Iraq and her efforts, along with the support of the Winnipeg Jewish Community, to help some Yazidi families to resettle in Winnipeg.

Estimated Profit: \$16,500

The Greening of RIBFEST: Darren Swanson and his Green Team did a great job of sorting the waste and recycling as much as possible. See the numbers below:

- **Compost:** 20 cubic yards (12 cubic yards in 2017)
- Recycling: 23 cubic yards (14 cubic yards in 2017)
- Garbage: 20 cubic yards (about same in 2017, slightly less)
- Grease: 475 gallons (225 gallons last year)
- Bicycle Corral: 177 cyclists (113 in 2017)

On October 17th, **Kelly Falardeau**, the Co-founder of **Blankets for Burn Kids** spoke to us about her experience as a burn victim from the age of 2, and her current mission to ensure that Burn Kids feel that "You are loved, You are needed and You are wanted." 75% of Kelly's body was burned at the age of two. She had many operations and skin grafts during her youth. She experienced bullying because of her scares. Today, she and her sons advocate for Burn Kids to ensure that they feel loved, needed & wanted.

On October 24th. **Gwen Buccini,** founder of **Tabs for Wheelchairs** spoke to us about her leadership over 20 years to collect enough Tabs in order to provide 20 customized wheelchairs for local youth.

- One Wheelchair requires about 14,000,000 Tabs
- Why just the Tabs? The Tabs are a higher quality aluminium and storing the cans would require too much space.
- The Tabs are sold to a local scrap dealer and the funds are used to purchase the wheelchairs. (Eg. .60 cents per lb of Tabs.)

REPORT ON THE "PERMANENT ENDOWMENT FUND" (PEF) of the ROTARY CLUB OF WINNIPEG

ON OCTOBER 18th., THE **CONTRIBUTORS AND TRUSTEES OF THE PERMANENT ENDOWMENT FUND** OF THE ROTARY CLUB OF WINNIPEG HELD ITS **ANNUAL MEETING** TO REVIEW THE PAST YEAR AND ELECT ITS BOARD AND ITS INVESTMENT COMMITTEE.

THE PEF MANAGES A **PORTFOLIO OF \$1.2 MILLION** WITH THE AIM OF PROVIDING INCOME TO THE CHARITY ARM OF OUR ROTARY CLUB. THIS MONEY IS THE RESULT OF MANY YEARS OF DONATIONS AND BEQUESTS BY OUR MEMBERS.

A ROTARIAN BY THE NAME OF TOM SILL CAME UP WITH THIS IDEA IN 1967 AND WAS A MAJOR CONTRIBUTOR DURING HIS LIFETIME. HE GATHERED A GROUP OF ROTARIANS AROUND HIM WHO SUPPORTED THIS IDEA FINANCIALLY AND THE PEF OF THE ROTARY CLUB OF WINNIPEG WAS BORN. BY THE WAY, CURRENT MEMBERS CHARLIE CURTIS AND ANNALIESE KALLENBACK ATTENDED THE INAUGERAL MEETING.

SINCE THIS ENDOWMENT FUND PREDATES THE ROTARY INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION IT HAS BEEN GRANDFATHERED EVEN THOUGH ANY NEW SUCH FUNDS ARE NOT ALLOWED.

ROTARIANS WHO DONATE AT LEAST \$500 TO THE PEF BECOME CONTRIBUTORS AND ATTEND THE ANNUAL MEETING. IF SOMEONE DID NOT HAVE THE \$500 IN ONE LUMP THEY ARE ALLOWED TO JOIN WITH A COMMITMENT TO PROVIDE THE \$500 OVER TIME. WE WOULD LIKE TO ENCOURAGE MORE ROTARIANS IN OUR CLUB TO BECOME MEMBERS.

AS SOME OF YOU MAY BE AWARE THE PEF SUPPLIES THE BULK OF THE FUNDS FOR THE COMMUNITY SERVICES FUND BUT IT IS NOT WELL KNOWN NOR WELL UNDERSTOOD BY MANY MEMBERS OF OUR CLUB. I WOULD LIKE TO CHANGE THAT THROUGH THIS TALK AND FUTURE SUCH TALKS.

THE KEY POINT IS THAT CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE PEF BUILD INCOME THAT GOES ON YEAR AFTER YEAR IN SUPPORT OF OUR CHARITY ACTIVITIES. THIS YEAR THE PEF HAS PROVIDED \$40,000 TO THE COMMUNITY SERVICES FUND AND IT LOOKS LIKE THE FUNDING WILL INCREASE TO ABOUT \$43,000 NEXT FISCAL YEAR.



HISTORICAL NOTE: Rotary Club of Winnipeg:

I have a copy of my Father's temporary membership for the Winnipeg Rotary, circa 1942, as a "member of the armed forces." He was born in Canada but became an American citizen. I was sitting in my Rotary Club meeting



today (San Bruno, California) and it occurred to me you might like to see a copy.

I didn't know that you were the first "International" Rotary, but I can't think of a better country for that to happen than Canada! There's a long (and to others, probably boring) family story, but the short version is that my father (Donald J. Acheson) was born in Ontario, but raised in southern California (Redlands). Most of my father's family remains in Canada, we just had a reunion of "Achesons" (and thereabouts) in Calgary. My Dad's father, Joseph Acheson (a member of the Winnipeg Rotary Club) remained in Canada for a good portion of his life, while my father remained in the United

States. My father joined the US Army Air Force in 1942, so his visit would have been sometime after that.

All the best! I hope if you or other members of your club ever come to Northern California (San Bruno is about 10 miles south of San Francisco), you'll come to our Rotary Club meeting, and should I ever get to Winnipeg.....

Note: The card was signed by J.A. Pottruff who was President from 1943-44, and District Governor 1946-47
