



Winter Must Be Around The Corner Poem by Hebert Logerie




She has also served as Vice President of a Rotaract Club, where she worked alongside fellow members on various community projects.

The Object of Rotary


is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:




