Program - Club Assembly - RibFest 2017



Meeting Chair Walt Pawlovich invited Boris Kishchuk to lead a report on the status of RibFest 2017

RibFest Committee Chair Boris Kishchuk, assisted by other committee members, updated the club on plans for RibFest, to be held August 4-7, 2017. Points noted included the following:

- Norm Woodcock - We will be back at Diefenbaker Park for sure. If the Optimists raise enough money to start construction of the Winter Park we will move to an alternate location on the east side of the perimeter road. Otherwise, we will be where we always have been. The Optimists will know by mid-May.
- The Super Run Car Show will be held at Prairieland Park the same weekend as RibFest. This happens every three years. It should bring in extra traffic.
- Bryan Tastad - We have received new sponsorships from Tourism Saskatoon (\$7,000), Dakota Dunes (\$5,000) and Sask Milk (\$2,500), plus advertising support from Saskatchewan Tourism. These more than compensate for losing Cameco's \$10,000 sponsorship. Please follow up with your personal contacts using the sponsorship grid delivered with the Rotana or

- Eileen Harvey - RibFest is included on the appropriate website calendars, in the Saskatoon Discovery Guide, Explore YXE and Experience Saskatoon.
- Bill Sinnett - We will use the same supplier to operate the 50/50 draw. Tickets will once again be sold for \$10, \$20 or \$40. It was decided not to print paper tickets for advance sales, however, you can take money in advance and enter the names and telephone numbers once the machines are available. We also will enter the first three digits of the postal code as a way of capturing demographic information.
- Betty Ann Arscott - Five food vendors have been confirmed. If vendors pay extra they can have exclusivity for their product line.
- Bryan Harvey - We will use the same supplier as last year for ATM services.
- Kim Horan - Beverage supply on track on the same basis as last year.
- We will once again have text phone voting for the People's Choice Award. Kim will check to see if we can enter the first three digit of the postal code to track demographics.
- The budget aims for a net profit of \$34,000.
- Peggy Clark will ask members to sign up early for volunteer duties.
- Boris Kishchuk - The committee has been wrestling with the options of requiring an admission charge or making a stronger push for donations. The consensus of the club was to keep the admission free but to do more to encourage donations.
