Program - Club Assembly



Maureen: A native of Uganda, she is a mother of 2 daughters and has 4 adopted children. She is heavily involved with Joy's Centre – a school for some 200 children and youth that her mother started and has been involved with for several years. Her presentation outlined some aspects of the school and community. Uganda is able to grow good crops but is isolated from transportation. They are planting crops and trees to improve the possibility of increased revenue to the area. They are working to improve education as well as farming practices. A major problem is financing the school. One major way is to have children sponsored (at \$1 per day). The school can only increase the number of students by obtaining sponsors so that more teachers can be hired.

Earle Newton: A Saskatoon native and long-time Rotarian, Earle and his wife have been involved with Joy's Centre for several years. He is very involved in making Joy's Centre a Rotary International project. By doing so, more financial assistance can be obtained from district and international sources (Rotary Foundation) which, in turn, will allow for more and better education for the children and a better life for the community. He is currently well into the process while encouraging local schools and individuals – you and I – to consider sponsoring and providing any other help that we can.
