This Week's Program Highlights

The meeting prelude was a live action session of Larry figuring out Zoom on his devices. Work on it Larry!

Chair – President Lorne Braithwaite opened the meeting by thanking everyone for signing on, thanking the various meeting helpers, giving special recognition to our speaker, Jolene Zidkovich and acknowledging that we are meeting on Treaty 6 land and home of the Metis'.

Music – O Canada and the 4 Way Test song were led live by Betty Ann and her keyboard.

Program - Jolene Zidkovich - Saskatoon Food Bank and Learning Centre

Candace Odishaw introduced Jolene. Jolene has been with the Food Bank for 5 years. Currently she is responsible for all of the programming at the Food Bank.

Jolene began by explaining that the Food Bank is about more than food.

Some of the areas where the Food Bank provides programming are as follows:

Adult Learning - 4 to 6 week program with the recipient acquiring a skill that can be used to get permanent job, This is the only program at the Food Bank that gets government funding.

Food Program – recipients receive a 2 to 3 day emergency supply of food every two weeks.

Clothing depot – accept donations of clean used clothing

and toiletries.

- Income Tax Preparation 40 volunteers prepared returns for 6000 clients in 2019. This activity resulted in \$25m of refunds injected into the community. Affinity Credit Union funds this program.
- Urban Agriculture 10 employees and 2000 volunteers tend the plot at the north end of 2nd
 Avenue. 12,000 pounds of vegetables were harvested in 2020. There is significant community
 engagement at the garden.
- Nutrition the teaching of kitchen, cooking and nutrition skills.
- Food Hampers perform in conjunction with the Salvation Army.

Many programs have been cancelled due to Covid or have had to pivot their method of delivery. Local grocery chains have been very supportive of the Food Bank with donations of unsaleable groceries. The Food Bank has been in operation in Saskatoon for 25 years and there doesn't appear to be less need currently.

Jolene is very grateful for the efforts of Nutana Rotary raising funds through the auction for the Food Bank.

Michael Gramiak thanked Jolene on behalf of the club.

Cheer Captain –Bob McGillivray asked for Happy and Sad \$.

Several members noted the passing of Bev Shiffman and donated in her memory.

Members noted as contributing were Jim Gillis, Kim, Norm, Larry, Lorne, Betty Ann, Eileen, Joe, Walt, Jack, Stan, Candace. Bob had some happy\$ because he had his hip surgery staples removed

and now he can run away from his Mommy again.
