Program - Susan Fowler-Kerry - College of Nursing's International Work



Eileen Harvey introduced Professor Susan Fowler-Kerry of the College of Nursing at the U of S. Susan has worked with colleagues around the world in her specialty of pediatric pain, including chairing World Health Organization conferences on the subject. She described some of the College of Nursing's international partnerships, focusing on the Philippines and Uganda. In both cases, the College of Nursing placed students in health care settings in these countries for several weeks. Susan said the program is a great two-way learning experience and helps to equip students to better deal with the increasing diversity of the Canadian population. At the moment, the U of S has placed a freeze on such placements for reasons that have not been made clear. Susan looks forward to the program being restarted.
