## Program - Angie Bugg and Hayley Carlson - Carbon Pricing



Jim Blackburn introduced Angie Bugg and Hayley Carlson of the Saskatchewan Environmental Society. Angie and Hayley worked as a team to explain why we need to reduce emissions of carbon and other greenhouse gases and the various options for doing so. Angie focused on the evidence for climate change and the need for countries to work together to control greenhouse gas emissions, as agreed in the Paris Accord of 2015. She said Saskatchewan could feel the impact of climate change through things like plant diseases, inability to make ice roads in the winter, longer droughts, more flooding, invasive species and forest fires. Hayley's part of the presentation focused on the various policy alternatives available to control greenhouse gas emissions. The market-based solutions include carbon pricing or a cap and trade system. Other options include government regulations and carbon capture and storage. She sees a consensus developing around a program of flexible regulation and modest carbon pricing. Angie reminded us that we can all help to reduce greenhouse gas emissions through means such as buying the most efficient appliances, turning power off when it is not needed, turning the heat down when we are away or asleep, and driving efficiently.
