**Program - Harold Chapman - Order of Canada**



Jim Blackburn introduced Past President and Honorary Member Harold Chapman who was recently awarded the Order of Canada for his service to the co-operative movement and to community development in Canada and abroad for more than 70 years. Harold's family farmed near Saskatoon and later moved to Meskanaw. With the encouragement of his mother, Harold pursued higher education at a time when many farm boys never finished grade 8. He attended the College of Agriculture at the U of S. A fateful decision occurred when he switched his specialty from plant breeding to farm management, which included a class in co-operatives. After serving as an officer in the Canadian Army in World War II, Harold joined the Saskatchewan government's newly formed Department of Co-operatives and Co-operative Development. He helped set up co-operatives all over Saskatchewan. In 1952 he was part of the Secretariat for the Royal Commission on Agriculture, chaired by Bill Baker, which conducted meetings across Saskatchewan on issues related to agriculture and community development. This experience led to work in adult learning and his role as the first Principal of the Western Co-operative College, later the Co-operative College of Canada. In his position, Harold developed programs for training co-operative leaders. Harold retired from Federated Co-operatives Limited in 1982 but has remained active as a consultant, author and speaker since then. He looks forward to receiving his Order of Canada medal from the Governor General in May 2017. Norm Woodcock expressed the club's thanks. Harold received a standing ovation for his spirited presentation.
