**Program - Barry Brown - Beekeeping**



Bob Devrome introduced Barry Brown, professor emeritus in the College of Education at the U of S and owner of the Bar2Bee Honey Ranch at Langham. Barry has been a beekeeper for the past 43 years, but the history of beekeeping goes back even longer as the first evidence of beekeeping dates to some 8,000 years ago. Humans have been able to derive many great products from the work of bees, including honey, propolis, pollen, mead, royal jelly and wax. The real importance of bees to people, however, is their role in pollinating plants. Tame bees are essential to the production of many foods. This makes the threats faced by bee populations around the world a matter of grave concern. These threats include hive mites, pesticides and fungicides, wax moths, hive beetles, bears, skunks, badgers and colony collapse disorder. Barry introduced us to the life cycle of bees as well as the annual cycle of beekeeping. He treated us to samples of his honey and gave away door prizes of wax candles and a bottle of mead. Joe Dierker expressed the club's thanks.
