Program - Caroline Cameron and Aleksandra Grochulski - Irene and Les Dubé Centre



Candace Odishaw introduced Caroline Cameron, RN, and Aleksandra Grochulski, OT, of the Irene and Les Dubé Centre for Mental Health. Caroline said one in five Canadians will experience a mental health or addiction problem and that mental health is the leading cause of disability in Canada. There are some 4,000 suicides each year and the suicide rate for First Nations youth is six times more than for non First Nations. Despite the prevalence of mental health issues, many Canadians do not seek the help they need due to the stigma attached to this disease. She said programs such as Bell's Let's Talk are helping to encourage discussion and break down barriers. Aleksandra spoke about the growing demand at the Dubé Centre. Problems dealt with include anxiety, bipolar, delusional, depression, eating disorders, schizophrenia and substance abuse disorder. Demand is so great that some patients must be housed at external locations. Treatment is provided by teams that include psychiatrists, nurses, OTs, pharmacists, social workers, recreational therapists, doctors, youth care workers and addiction counselors. Donations have made it possible for the Dubé Centre to offer new opportunities, such as an art studio and sensory processing room. Candace expressed the club's thanks.

Program - Boris Kishchuk - RibFest

Boris Kishchuk led a discussion of plans for RibFest to be held August 4-7. Points noted included:

- Those working at the gate should ask visitors to donate.
- Corn on the cob will sell for \$3 each.
- Entertainment has been reduced. There will be eight groups, each playing longer than in the past.
