## Program - Clay Shaw - Saskatoon Youth Art Project



Walt Pawlovich introduced Clay Shaw, Operations Manager for Saskatoon Community Youth Arts Programming (SCYAP). Clay joined SCYAP in 2016 after 18 years as a Corrections Officer. SCYAP is a charitable and non-profit organization that meets the social, educational and economic needs of youth at risk through arts and cultural programming. SCYAP was established in 2001 by Darrell B. Lechman, to offer street-level, youth-centered solutions to crime, unemployment and youth homelessness by using our youth's artistic interest and inclination as a tool to personal development and redirection towards a healthier, happier and more productive life. One of SCYAP's principal goals is to foster acceptance, integration and equality within the Saskatoon community by carrying out collaborative projects with different sectors, such as business, government, social and health services, and promoting inclusiveness and diverse cultural expression in classes, workshops and presentations. SCYAP offers a 34 week program for 12 at-risk youth, paying them to attend a level 1 art class. Through art and other classes, the program boosts self-esteem, confidence and skills in areas such as communication, budgeting and time management. Of the 12 graduates of the most recent class, 11 are either now employed or back in school and the 12th is receiving professional help for mental health issues. SCYAP participants are responsible for most of the painted electrical boxes around the city and various murals. The organization also runs an art gallery at its building at 253 3rd Ave. S. Free art drop-in classes on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Saturday evenings are open to the whole community. For more information on SCYAP, visit <http://www.scyapinc.org/>.
