Nobel Laureate ceremony at the Peace Plaza in Rotary Park, laying a wreath on behalf of Rotary at the Remembrance Day Ceremony, working in the Enchanted Forest booth and at the Salvation Army kettles, increasing club membership through the establishment of a satellite club, implementing the club's first Scavenger Hunt, and issuing cheques to support the work of agencies such as St. Frances Cree Bilingual School and Oskayak High School.
