Program - Kim Horan - Protecting Your Computer



Candace Odishaw introduced our own Kim Horan who advised on how to protect our computers from viruses and other intrusions. Some notes were:

- For virus protection software, more is not better. Use one program only. The program that comes bundled with Microsoft Windows is adequate, but you have to make sure it is up to date.
- Longer passwords are better than shorter ones. Include capitals and numerals. It's okay to write your passwords down, but store them in a safe place at home.
- Don't rely on hearsay about computer threats. You can check www.snopes.com to find out for sure.
- Be wary of links contained within the body of email messages. If you hover the mouse over the link you should be able to see the full address. If it looks suspicious, delete the email message.
- Websites can download viruses onto your computer even if you don't do anything on the site.
- You don't have to open a file to be infected. It's a good idea to close the preview pane on your email program.
- You can check www.haveibeenpwned.com to see if anyone has stolen your identity.
