Norm Woodcock introduced Allyson Brady, Executive Director of the Saskatchewan Environmental Society, and Jason Praski, a board member of SES Solar Co-op and a renewable energy consultant. Their topic was Renewable Rides, a multi-partner project that has placed five shareable electric cars on Saskatoon streets. The energy to power the cars is supplied by SES Solar Co-op and the ride sharing is administered through Saskatoon Car Share Co-op. Other partners include Affinity Credit Union, Saskatoon Light and Power, Radiance Co-Housing and Wardell Gillis law firm. Allyson and Jason said electric cars are highly practical even in Saskatoon's cold winters. The sticker price is high but the maintenance costs are low.
