Program - Lorne Braithwaite - This is My Life



President Peggy introduced our own Lorne Braithwaite, who spoke about his life. Lorne had an idyllic childhood growing up in Montgomery Place. This neighbourhood was settled by World War II veterans under the Veterans Land Act so the families were of similar ages, creating a strong sense of community. His family took memorable summer vacations, including to Expo 67 in Montreal. Lorne's first job was at the 22nd Street McDonalds. After discovering that university was not the right fit, he worked at a variety of jobs until he found a home in the retail industry with Kelly's Stereo. He later owned and operated a gift store in Regina for 14 years before moving back to Saskatoon. Since his return, he worked for Nagel's Audio-Visual and, currently, Richardson's Lighting. Lorne is honored to be part of Rotary. He first joined the Rotary Club of Regina South, then joined Saskatoon Nutana upon his return to this city. President Peggy expressed the club's thanks.
