Program - Carol S. Henry - U of S Ethiopia Project



Jim Blackburn introduced Carol S. Henry, professor in the College of Pharmacy and Nutrition at the University of Saskatchewan. For more than 20 years the U of S has been partnering with Hawassa University in Ethiopia on a project that involves both agricultural practices and nutrition. The project was launched to help Ethiopia address problems of soil degradation by planting pulse crops, such as chickpeas and haricot beans, that fix nitrogen in the soil. The project also involves educating families on the benefits of including pulses in their diets. As well, efforts have been made to have women become more involved in agriculture. The project is now looking to maintain funding for this successful project from the Canadian government. Jack Scott expressed the club's thanks.
