Program - Harold Chapman - Speech to 2017 Graduates



Candace Odishaw introduced our own 101-year-old force of nature Harold Chapman. One year ago Harold was awarded an Honorary Doctor of Laws degree by the University of Saskatchewan. The speech he gave to us was the same one he gave to U of S graduates at the convocation. Harold remembered sitting among his fellow graduates way back

in May 1943 when he graduated from the College of Agriculture. Harold wasn't thinking about getting a job, however, as he was already committed to entering military service with the Canadian Army. He completed officer training just before the war ended, so did not get overseas. When he returned to Saskatchewan Harold joined the provincial Department of Co-operation, launching a 70 year career in the field of co-operative development and education for which he was inducted into the Order of Canada in 2017. Harold shared his three rules for enjoying a long and happy life (besides inheriting good genes from your parents):

1. No smoking.
2. Moderation in the pleasures of life.
3. Cultivate and enjoy personal relationships in an atmosphere of mutual respect.
