Guest Speaker – Aggie Allen

Mike introduced Aggie Allen, the Coordinator of the Saskatoon Tribal Council's Maternal & Child Health Home Visiting Program. Aggie has had extensive experience in this field and has served in her current position since 2011. The Saskatoon Tribal Council is made up of 7 First Nations: Kinistin Salteaux, Muskeg Lake Cree, Mistawasis, Whitecap Dakota, Yellow Quill, Muskoday and One Arrow.

The STC Maternal and Child Care program provides support during pregnancy and for children up to 6 years of age. Home visitors are provided with a training certification program which also is an introductory education program for those who wish to pursue more enhanced positions in this field. Many of the visitors further their education by taking prenatal care classes, traditional teaching, health nutrition, support for community health nurses, breast feeding, fetal alcohol education, postpartum depression, as well as attachment and bonding. The goal is to encourage the family to live a healthy lifestyle so it empowers the parents to become confident and goal orientated to support communities and services. It has been difficult to provide the program during the pandemic. They have the clients put up signs in their windows indicating if they are doing well or not doing so good. They are currently in a 30 day lockdown. They don't have an active fund raising program but they are always looking for books and other donations that will assist the families.

Betty Ann thanked Aggie for an inspirational presentation and indicated we are making a donation to Read Saskatoon on her behalf.

Cheer Captain - Mike noted that during the Covid winter months he replaced his usual activities by playing Sodoku and crosswords with his girlfriend. Peggy indicates she is doing more sewing for her grandchildren; Bob is reading more books and he indicates that Janet beats him at scrabble (the question was does she beat him before he plays or after???); Jack keeps gaining weight around the middle. Asit made us feel bad because he has taken up baking and delivered muffins and cookies to 10 young families; Norm indicated he had a bit of a setback but is now doing OK; Ravi was happy to have his teaching over for the year as well as indicating this is the time of celebration for the Northern India harvest. Kim; Bob; Betty; Lorne; Will (\$4.34 and \$5.66) for the Friendship Centre delivering 158 injections to people living on the street; Candace for Candy Crush and for starting to write a book; Karol for going from being a mechanical engineer to getting into gardening with tulips and roses to now becoming a sheep farmer.
