Canadian girl who really helped him with his education when he was young and he decided he wanted to go to Canada if an opportunity presented itself. He loved reading but he had to do it outside under a street lamp because of lack of electricity in their home. He received a scholarship to study in England. He came to Saskatoon to study for his PhD. He returned to England and wanted to learn how he could improve the health situation in Ghana. His first goal was to build a library which continues to this day. He is seeking funding and donors can make contributions at adastrafoundationgh.org. While the building is continuing, he has established a mobile lending library. In Saskatoon, he teaches his students on global change, health problems and ways to improve the standard of living.

Dorothy expressed the thanks of the club for a very informative presentation and encouraged members to consider their support.

A short video was presented "Equitable Water and Sanitation in Upper East Ghana" which is the club's Global Grant Project and co-sponsored by all the Saskatoon Clubs and a Rotary Club in Michigan.
