- Nominations are open for new board directors. If you are interested contact Mike or Lorne.

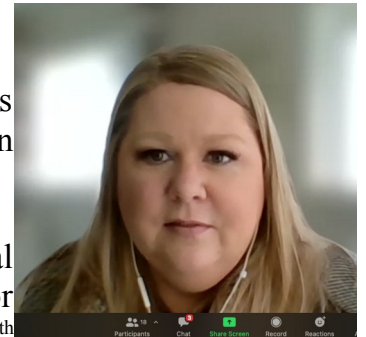
PROGRAM

Peggy Clark introduced Carol Cooley and Jana Sampson from the Saskatoon Public Library as our guest speakers.



Carol Cooley is a Professional Librarian who became the CEO of the Saskatoon Public Library in 2015. Her focus since 2015 has been modernization of the Saskatoon Library system and reconciliation.

Jana Sampson has a B. Comm from the U of S and has worked as Director of Marketing and Communication for the Public Library for the past 6 years.



The topic of their presentation is the new Central Library Building. Construction is to begin in 2023 with opening slated for 2026. The location of the new building is 321 2nd Avenue North, between 24th St and 25th Street.

The presentation was in power point with explanations. The basics for the building are 136,000 ft² on four levels with a budgeted cost of \$134,000,000. The new building has its own website: Saskatooncentrallibrary.ca that contains all design data including floor plans. This is the place to go if you want to check out the new building in depth

After a question and answer session Betty Ann Arscott thanked Carol and Jana on behalf of the club. The club will be making a donation to Read Saskatoon to mark their presentation.
