Will noted that the Nutana Rotary logo now appears on both of the Friendship Centre's new vans. Pictures of vans were shown to members, illustrating the extensive art work Métis and First Nation artists, including Ernie Scoles, Kevin Peeace, Audrey Armstrong, Ray Keighley, Jannica Hoskins, Jerry Whitehead, and Clayton Binning. Will indicated that SIMFC has distributed 10,000 meals and another 1200 have been served and he thanked our Club for the past support and recent support from the Easter Scavenger Hunt.

The 4 way test District online zoom meeting chaired by Jim Gillis was a great success.

Guest Speaker

Mike Gramiak introduced District Governor Elect, Lindsay May from Sydney, Australia, who will speak about the Sydney to Hobart Yacht Race. Lindsay has had an outstanding career in business, in Rotary and in his favorite pastime, yacht racing! For all his contributions, he was awarded the Order of Australia in 2017 which is an outstanding indication of the fantastic volunteer work that he has done for the country and the world. In 1977, he came to Saskatoon on a Group Study Exchange and showed a photograph, taken in Nipawin, that included Cliff Worden and the then Exchange Student Sue Paul from Adelaide. Joe indicated that Harold Chapman was also in the photo. He also had a photo of John and Mary Lou Montgomery as he stayed in their home in Saskatoon. During that exchange he also travelled throughout the district as well as Thompson and Flin Flon, Manitoba.

Lindsay indicated he came across our 4-way test song online and they want to use it in Australia. Lindsay used photos and videos to describe the Rolex Sydney to Hobart Yacht Race. It is 628 nautical miles and the 75th race was held in 2019 (first race in 1945). There was no race in 2020. The race begins at 1 PM on Dec. 26 with a cannon start. For the larger 100 ft. yachts, it takes them about one day to cover the distance. For yachts like the 50 footer that Lindsay sails, it is usually 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ days. Lindsay has been in 47 consecutive races and captained the yacht in 2006 when they won the handicap event (smaller yachts). At this time, Lindsay holds the record for consecutive number of races. Actual record is 52 races by Tony 'Ace' Ellis, though they are not consecutive. Lindsay's crew contained 10 sailors and the larger boats have crews of 20 – 24. In 1998, they experienced terrible weather and had to evacuate over 50 sailors with 6 crew members perishing and 6 boats were lost. He showed photos of that race with the really rough seas! There is no prize money for the race, just Rolex watches and trophies.

Ravi Chibbar thanked Lindsay for his exciting visual presentation and stated that our club will make a donation to Read Saskatoon on his behalf.
