As our Incoming President, Mike attended the recent District 5550 Leadership Seminar. The seminar focused on the District's strategic plan; learning from other clubs; how does each club fit in the District's eyes and how we should build our legacy.

The strategic plan goals include eliminating or decreasing child poverty (every child must have nutritious food, potable water, clothing, good health and education), membership (how do we better engage our current members, maximize each other's strengths and disguise each other's weaknesses, how do we ensure people aren't left out), public image and PR (develop multi-club websites to spread the word, how do we distinguish Rotary from other service clubs) and developing an effective leadership team (how do we identify leaders and encourage new leaders with leadership skills development).

The district needs to enhance opportunities to learn from other club's successes with more sharing and greater emphasis in developing our future leaders.

Mike commented on how our club is viewed in the District's eyes. Our 4-way test song has received wide publicity and is being used by clubs across the country. Our Corporate membership category with the inclusion of the Indian and Metis Friendship Centre and satellite club at the University were also highlights. Having a young leader in Mike is probably our biggest step forward!!
