Dorothy Hudson introduced Diane Smith who is the Regional Manager of Scientists in School. Scientists in School is a Canadian education charity. Diane presented via Zoom from her home in Calgary. The following is a selection of her slides that explains the goals of the organization, the methods it uses in the schools and the variety of delivery methods for the programs. The in-school presenters are primarily scientists and technicians with post secondary education.

The program began in Ontario but is now available in 10 provinces. Scientists in School is in Saskatchewan and Saskatoon,

Scientists in School is a high impact Canadian education charity, dedicated to establishing a strong foundation of science and innovation among youth in Canada.

## **Key Goals:**

- **For youth,** increased interest, confidence, engagement, and understanding of the relevance of STEM in the world around them.
- For elementary teachers, a professional learning opportunity that helps build knowledge and confidence, and that enriches STEM teaching practices.



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# **Growing STEM Skills and Connections through Experiential Learning**



Building STEM skills requires safe, practical, hands-on experiential learning that supports students in being successful and develops their scientific and technological literacy – exactly what Scientists in School provides!



# **Two Delivery Models**

All our workshops are hands-on, investigative, curriculumaligned, and led by trained STEM experts and role models

## **Virtual Workshops**

- + 60 minutes
- + Join from anywhere across Canada
- Mini science bags with investigative materials shipped ahead for each student
- + Individual ownership of materials and investigations
- + Multi-camera views, up-close visuals

## **On-Site Workshops**

- + 90 minutes
- + Select topics available in Peel, Toronto, York, and Durham
- + Includes scientific materials and equipment for students to share
- + Pair and small group activities
- + We set up, clean up, and provide assistance where needed





# **Our Impact to Date in Saskatoon Schools**

- First outreach to Saskatchewan school boards in 2021
- 120 classroom workshops in Saskatoon schools over 2 years (Spring 2021-current)
- Of these, 35 workshops in 1 school in the Saskatoon Public School Board, and 85 over 8 schools in the Greater Saskatoon Catholic School Board
- In Saskatoon, the vast majority of these workshops have been supported by our equity stream
- 120 donor funded classroom workshops, a total value of \$37,800 in Saskatoon schools, with thanks to the generous support of multiple donors, nation wide

# **Our Impact to Date across Saskatchewan**

- First outreach to Saskatoon school boards in 2021
- 286 classroom workshops in Saskatchewan schools over 2 years (Spring 2021current)
- 166 of these are outside of Saskatoon.
- These 166 workshops are across 7 school boards, with significant growth in South Saskatchewan
- 166 donor funded classroom workshops, a total value of \$52,290 in these 7 boards, with thanks to the generous supports of multiple donors, often Saskatchewan
