PROGRAM

Walt introduced his grandson and our speaker Ben Carey. Ben is Provincial Coordinator of Volunteer Services at St. John Ambulance. Ben was accompanied by Alexandra Pavelich, a PhD student and therapy dog handler for St John Ambulance. Marcus, a therapy dog, was with Alexandra.





St John Ambulance(SJA) is the name of a number of affiliated organizations in mostly Commonwealth countries which teach and provide first aid, ambulance, and emergency medical services, and are primarily staffed by volunteers. The associations are overseen by the international Order of St John and its priories (national branches).

The first such organization to be founded was the St John Ambulance Association, which was founded on 10 July 1877 in England to teach first aid in large railway centres and mining districts.

St John Ambulance now have over 40 national organizations and over 300,000 volunteers worldwide.

In Saskatchewan there are St John Ambulance branches in Regina, Saskatoon, Moose Jaw, Prince Albert and Lloydminster.

St John Ambulance is most visible for its provision of First Aide at various events and First Aide training for individuals, groups and organizations.

The focus of todays talk is SJA Therapy Dog program. In Saskatchewan there are 120 dog therapy teams. Typically the teams go to where there is a need such as hospitals, schools, seniors facilities, universities, events and prisons. The benefits of therapy dog contact are myriad such as mood improvement. lower stress, provide comfort, motivate movement, mind stimulation and distraction.

These benefits have been proven in clinical trials that can be referenced through pawsitiveconnectionslab.com

Alexandra related stories of how the therapy dogs had helped people cope with stressful situations in hospitals and schools.
