PROGRAM

Boris Kishchuk introduced Chris MacLeod. Chris spoke to the club about a month ago about his life living with Cystic Fibrosis(CF). Today Chris will talk about his book "Beating the Odds", how the book came to be and one of the lessons learned "Be the CEO of Your Own Health"

As a result of having CF Chris spent long periods of time in hospitals battling infections. In 2012 he was part of the first group of CF patients in Canada to be treated with gene modulator therapy. For Chris the treatment was phenominally successful, his lung efficiency went from 26% TO 60% almost immediately. A doctor during this time noted Chris' relentless positive attitude and asked for his reasons for this. Chris jotted down 11 lessons learned and these became the genesis for the book.



The main thrust of the rest of the talk was "Be the CEO of Your Own Health". If you are in charge of your health, act like it. Find out what tests you are getting and find out the results of the tests. Get up, clean up, dress up and show up every day you are in hospital, make it look like you are in charge. Make your own decisions about your health care then live with your decisions. Sometimes your decision will be right, sometimes it will be wrong but own it no matter the outcome.

Betty Ann Arscott thanked Chris on behalf of the club for his powerful presentation.
