PROGRAM.

Jim Gillis introduced David Katzman who is a former school principal and currently practices conflict resolution and mediation. David presented from Penticton via Zoom.

The title of David's presentation was Conflict Resolution in the Community – Dealing with Hate.

The root causes of hate are power and greed. Lasting peace is based upon the elements Justice, Truth and Education.

Justice – can be obtained by brute force or fairness. Lasting peace needs justice based upon fairness.

Truth – Lasting peace must be based upon the truth

Education- lasting peace must contain an element of education about the past and the injustices of the past. Remember that history is written by the victors. Recommended reading is a book "Clearing the Plains" about the elimination of First Nations from the prairies to make way for settlement.

There are instances where conflict can only be resolved by violent means. An example is the war against the Ukraine which must be stopped by any means possible

Jim Gillis thanked David for his presentation and invited him back to explore this topic further.
