PROGRAM.

Jim Gillis introduced our speakers from the Saskatoon Indian Metis Friendship Centre(SIMFC). Bill Dupre has been at SIMFC for three years. Prior to that he worked in the Prince Albert area for First Nations and First Nations affiliated groups. Edward Ermine will coordinate the food security facilities construction for SIMFC. Bill is a member of the Laronge Cree First Nation.

Bill spoke to the club about two recent initiatives by SIMFC, Food Security and Transitional Housing.

Food Security

SIMFC has leased land from the Meewasin Valley Authority on Valley Road. This property will be the location of two 23' x 49' greenhouses. The purpose is to grow produce for use in the SIMFC kitchen and as a learning opportunity for learn by clients. There will also be a opportunity on the property to observe indigenous plants and learn of their use. An additional component will be the construction of smaller greenhouses by SIMFC clients to be located adjacent to the downtown building. The clients will learn new skills and the produce will be used in the kitchen.

Transitional Housing

SIMFC has obtained 3 houses from the Saskatoon Housing Authority for us by the homeless so they may transition into a more permanent housing arrangement. Details of this programme may be seen in the attached pdf.

Bill also thanked the club for their donation of winter clothing for SIMFC clients. The need is continuous so there will always be a need, no one is turned away. SIMFC also provides winter and summer survival packs to select clients to help their clients survive the elements.

Dorothy thanked Bill on behalf of the club.
