PROGRAM.

Jim Blackburn introduced Murray Scharf. They are alumni of Nutana Collegiate from 1956. Murray achieved a Bachelor's of Education along with further degrees ending up at the University of Saskatchewan as the Dean of Education.

Murray provided some historical background which saw mostly Methodist and Presbyterian settlers settle in Nutana on the east side of the river. There was a ferry at the bottom of Victoria Avenue that was used to transport troops over to the west side of the river and wounded soldiers back from the west to the east during the Riel rebellion.

As the population of the city grew larger on the west side of the River, education was provided on the East side and numerous bridges were built to accommodate the two way traffic.

In 1910 The Saskatoon Collegiate Institute now known as Nutana Collegiate initially held University classes and teacher training as the only Post Secondary institution in Saskatoon.

From 1919 to 1927 A.J. Pyke (the principal) and the student organization began the purchase and display of paintings to memorialize the school's WW1 war dead. The Memorial library was opened in 1954 in recognition of the 124 students of Nutana who fought and died for Canada in two world wars.

In 2016 in partnership with the University of Saskatchewan Great War Remembrance and Nutana Alumni Bill Waiser and Rick Iverson, the Refurbishment project was launched. The goal was to restore and return the paintings to Nutana to extend the vision for the collection established over a hundred years ago. The students wanted to memorialize the fallen alumni with paintings by Canadian artists and expose students to high quality artworks as part of their student experience at the school.

With technical expertise from Brenda Smith of the Mackenzie Art Gallery in Regina and the restoration work undertaken by the firm of Frase/Ricci Art and Archival Conservation Inc. eleven paintings were refurbished with \$ 52,000 raised from 126 donors. The principal Conservator at the firm is Sarah Spafford-Ricci an alumna of Nutana Collegiate.

There is an application in the works to declare the painting collection an historic site.

Walt Pawlovich thanked Murray on behalf of the club.
