PROGRAM

Speaker 1 – Kayla Demong, CEO & Executive Director, Prairie Harm Reduction

Dorothy introduced Kayla who Kayla has spent the last 16 years providing support to individuals, families and youth in our community focusing on harm reduction and how to better support people who use substances. Along with her work at Prairie Harm Reduction she serves on the board of directors for Quint Development and Station 20 West. She is born and raised in Saskatoon. Prairie Harm Reduction was renamed from AIDS Saskatoon in 2019.

PHR has its office at 1516 20th St. W. with a staff of 94, including 4 Directors and 10 at the management level. It is Saskatoon's only non-shelter drop-in centre and serves 500 cups of coffee a day as well as providing employment skills support and emotional assistance.

It is best known for being the first safe drug consumption site but that is only approximately 3 % of what they do (577 individuals utilize this service). They are the Naloxone community distribution site, distributing 4600 kits last year in addition to providing extensive training in its appropriate use. They also have apartment buildings on the other side of St. Paul's Hospital to provide child and family support where they service 109 families in the community and with two semi-independent youth homes. Other services include the HIV Holiday Hamper Program, work with youth to provide educational programs in a variety of ways and community cleanup programs. Their aim is "to catch vulnerable people to prevent them from falling through the cracks". They receive financial support from various levels of government but there is no financial support for the safe injection program so they operate from personal donations to keep the program going.

Speaker # 2 – Candace then introduced **Kara Kohl, the Guidance Councillor from Oskayak High School**. Candace indicated that she and President Mike will be attending the school graduation next Tuesday and we continue to provide two - \$ 1,000 scholarships to graduates annually. They continue to feature Cree Culture in all components of the program with smudges, sweats and Cree language education as examples. The graduation rate has improved in recent years but they noted an increase in mental health issues during Covid.

Both speakers were thanked for their excellent presentations.

CHEER CAPTAIN – Candace had a series of questions relating to our club meetings and programs including checking out other restaurants, once a month having a club hands-on project instead of a meeting, how to encourage membership, bringing perspective members to meetings and increasing corporate memberships.

Happy/sad dollars were provided by Joe, Jim Gillis, Asit, Karol, Ravi, Bob, Betty, Candace and Jim B.

Mike signed off on the last formal meeting of the year and thanked all who had worked with him over the great year in spite of Covid.
