PROGRAM.

The ROTARY THEME for June is FELLOWSHIP and Candace introduced a new member, Lt. Derek Kerr to give a vocational talk today.

Derek first joined Rotary in Goderich, Ontario. He was working with the Salvation Army and his employer encouraged him to join Rotary as a way to serve the community and build connections with leaders in the area.

Many years earlier when Derek's mom was in the hospital, she was surprised to receive a visit by Salvation Army staff who left her a gift basket. Derek and his family were very appreciative of this thoughtfulness.

As a young twenty-year-old, Derek began working for the City of Scarborough. One of his co-workers invited him to the Prayer Breakfast held every year and sponsored by the local Salvation Army. At that event Derek went forward to accept the Lord and he began a life-long journey with the Salvation Army.

Derek and his wife Angela accepted a move to Saskatoon and today they have a family of six children and both enjoy careers with the Salvation Army. Derek is Head of Community and Family Services and Angela is a Program Coordinator.

The Salvation Army offers many programs including the Christmas Kettles fundraiser, Shelters for the Homeless, Breakfast Food Support programs for young school children, Backpacks and school supplies for students, Summer Camps at Beaver Creek, etc.

The Salvation Army was originally called "The Christian Mission" and founded in Britain in 1865. The name was changed to The Salvation Army in 1882 and today the organization has spread to over 130 countries worldwide.

The 2022 Programs in Saskatoon had an overall budget of a million dollars. The Christmas Kettles program raised \$300,000. This provided Christmas hampers to deserving families but the funds also supported many other programs throughout the year. Individual and corporate donors have been very generous over the years and they are critical to supply the dollars required every year. As the need continues to increase, Lieutenant Derek and Lieutenant Angela are very busy growing the Salvation Army presence here in Saskatoon.

Outside the government, the Salvation Army is the largest social service organization in Canada.

Dorothy Hudson thanked Derek for his interesting vocational talk.
