He is looking forward to becoming a grandfather this summer, so the two of them will be readily available to spoil the grandchild!

During question period the Heart Lakes club members were asked what they will miss about Karol and they indicated his enthusiasm, his wacky sense of humor, his leadership, "the top 10 things that make us laugh" as well as his tools and his truck!

Karol has had to slow down due to his heart situation with no old timer hockey to look forward to, but he is excited about getting into sheep farming (main reason- he hates cutting grass so the sheep will remedy that situation).

Mike thanked Karol for his great presentation and indicated we are all excited to have him along with all his Rotary experience in our Club!
