Joe Dierker and Betty Ann Arscott introduced Laurie Hayes as our guest speaker.



Laurie Hayes is a Professional Agrologist with a Master's Degree from the College of Agriculture and Bioresources, University of Saskatchewan and certification as a Project Management Professional. She has been involved in many aspects of agriculture, ranging from primary production managing an applied research farm outside of Prince Albert through to business development and commercialization activities with the National Research Council. She has led many non-profit producer organizations through transitional challenges and actively serves her professional association, the Saskatchewan Institute of Agrologists. She is proud to be a farmer's daughter from Val Marie Saskatchewan.


Laurie is the Executive Director of the Saskatchewan Seed Growers Association(SSGA). This association was formed in 1928 to advocate for the best interests of pedigreed seed growers in Saskatchewan. It is an affiliate branch of the Canadian Seed Growers Association. The

pedigreed seed industry in Saskatchewan involves approximately 500 growers growing 25 different seed kinds. It generates 9000 jobs and contributes \$790 m to the Saskatchewan economy. Pedigreed seed is the foundation of the \$11B grain industry in Saskatchewan.

The development of a new variety from "birth" to become a commercially successful product is a long, rigorous and arduous process. Laurie explained the process in some detail encapsulated in this slide.



How is **Certifie**Seed Produced?



Saskatchewan produces 30% of the pedigreed seed grown in Canada including 55% of the oilseed, 84% of the lentils and 100% of the canary seed.

SSGA has developed a SASKSEED guide to help growers find certified seed. The guide is also in a computer based interactive version that Laurie demonstrated.

Walt Pawlovich thanked Laurie on behalf of the club. The club will be making a donation to Read Saskatoon to mark this presentation.
