## PROGRAM.

Betty Ann Arscott introduced Carla Delgado and Claire Ochitwa as our speakers.

Carla Delgado is the Vice-President of Development and Engagement at the YWCA. After spending 10years with Cameco Corporation joined the YWCA in 2020. The focus of her work is to secure funding for YWCA's work with vulnerable women.

Claire Ochitwa is a Campaign Cabinet Volunteer for the YWCA Hope Lives Here campaign. She has a Bachelor's degree in Marketing. Claire co- owns a business that creates magical memories for families. She also does volunteer work with the Saskatoon Womens Network

Carla began the presentation by explaining that the programming at the YWCA is organized under four umbrellas:

- Crisis Shelter and Residence
- Child Development Centre
- -Employment and Learning
- -Fitness on 25th

In 2021 the CrisisShelter and Residence had to turn away 3713 women who needed a safe place to stay. To address this situation and other needs the YWCA has developed the "Hope Lives Here" fund raising campaign.

Claire explained that the goal for the campaign is \$19m with the priorities being:

- 1) Increase long term transitional housing beds by 69.
- 2) Repair and renovate the existing building.
- 3) Expand Employment & Learning Centre

Claire asked for our support when the campaign kicks off the public portion in May

Nuru Nyoni thanked Carla and Claire on behalf of the club. The club will be making a donation to Foundations Learning(Read Saskatoon) in their name.
