#### **PROGRAM**

Betty Ann Arscott introduced Jourdy Gauvreau from the City of Saskatoon as our guest speaker.

Jourdy is a Process Engineer at the Saskatoon Water Treatment Plant. He has worked at the plant since 2018 as an intern and project engineer for the Maintenance group. He is now in Operations helping with plant production. Jourdy has lived in Saskatoon since 2001 and convocated from the U of S with a Bachelors in Toxicology (2015) and Chemical Engineering (2020). Jourdy plans to stay with the WTP and work towards his Professional Engineer designation in the near term.

The title of his presentation is Saskatoon Water – Source to Tap

Jourdy's presentation showed the treatment of the raw river water from river intake through treatment, to storage and then to distribution to residential and


commercial facilities. The first dedicated water treatment plant for Saskatoon was in 1911. The present treatment facility supplies Saskatoon with an average 80,000,000 l/day in the winter and 250,000,000 l/day in the winter.

This shows the treatment plant on Ave H and its treatment components.





## Water Treatment Process Overview



The water produced by the treatment plant is the highest quality water in the world and exceeds the minimum requirements by 10 times.

There are two storage facilities, one on Acadia Avenue and the other on 42<sup>nd</sup> Street. Projects for this season include upgrading the electricals for transfer pumping and completion of a reservoir in the north east
