SPEAKER:

Candace introduced the speaker, Amanda Lanoway, who she met when they worked together on the District Literacy Committee.

Amanda is a Rotarian from Regina and drove up to meet with the club. She is the Regional Lead for Central Canada with the Dollywood Foundation which covers Saskatchewan, Manitoba and Ontario. Amanda believes through literacy we have the ability to disrupt intergenerational poverty

Amanda has two children, a son who is 14 years old and a daughter, 11 years old. She has been a Rotarian for 8 years with the Rotary Club of Regina. She also served on the Board of Directors as the Literacy Representative and currently on the Public Image Committee.

The Dollywood Foundation, founded by Dolly Parton, is operating in five countries including all provinces in Canada. She talked about Dolly Parton starting the Dollywood Foundation at her hometown of Sevierville, Tennessee when she became interested in literacy with her kids.

The Dollywood Foundation is a non-profit organization that started in 1988. The Dolly Wood Imagination Library ("DIL") is a free reading programme and library resource for children from newborn to 5 years old.

The programme is a tribute to her father who was illiterate, which thus prompted her to set up a literacy programme. The DIL is a community-based book gifting program. One book a month is provided for children starting at birth up to 5 years old. The DIL corporate sponsors include Penguin Books. There are 6 employees in Canada in the DIL programme. These are high quality books. There are two classic books that are provided - "The Little Engine That Could," and "Look Out Kindergarten, Here I Come". Age-appropriate books are provided every month.

The Canadian programme is 83% Canadian content with 8% being of Indigenous books. Pricing averages \$3.85/ child/ month. About \$50 a year.

Unique benefits of the books that are sent are the book labels. It includes the child's name and reference to the lead champion or sponsor of the book. Stats: There are 3000 community partners in five countries. 263,000,000 books that have be mailed out since the programme started. 60,000 books have been sent monthly. Canada has 451 partnerships, with 15 partners in Saskatchewan. and 15 local partners in Saskatoon. 2,500 books/ month in Canada with 6,300 children receiving books.

Why This Program is important.

Early reading builds brains as 90% of the brain is developed – Brain Science. It builds a love of reading. Reading improves literacy that has a great educational impact by grade 3.

Walter Pawlovich thanked Amanda.


