## <u>Guest Speaker</u>

Ravi introduced our guest speaker, Dr. Scott Adams who spoke on "Science Fairs: Empowering the Next Generation of Researchers and Innovators". Ravi first met Scott when he was a grade 10 student at Walter Murray Collegiate. He came to his office and wanted to do a science project in microbiology. What a start that was – his project won the top prize in the Saskatoon Fair, the Saskatchewan Science Fair and the Canada-wide Science Fair!! He went on to represent Canada in the International Event. He subsequently went on to obtain his B.Sc. in cellular biology, his MD degree and is currently a Resident in Radiology. He is also completing his PhD in diagnostic radiology on a Vanier Scholarship and plans to have his thesis defence in late June. Next is postdoctoral studies at Harvard University. As a sideline, he is also Chair of the Regional Science Fairs of Saskatchewan and he has musical talents.

He described how exciting it was to work with Ravi on his first project looking at antisense ODN technology for silencing starch biosynthesis genes in wheat, which was the project that won him international acclaim. His current focus is to examine new techniques to permit access to medical imaging for underserved areas in northern, remote and indigenous communities. His group has been developing telerobotic approaches for providing ultrasound in these areas. They have applied these approaches to three northern Saskatchewan communities during the Covid pandemic with excellent results.

He discussed the Sanofi Biogenius Canada program which supports science fairs throughout Canada. Four to 6 students in Grades 7 - 11 from Saskatchewan advance to the Canada-wide competition. The 2021 national competition will have 6 students representing Saskatoon with a wide range of projects.

Scott outlined the benefits of the science fair's program. In his case, it made him decide early (grade 10) that he wanted a research career. Students need intrinsic and extrinsic motivation to pursue a career goal. It is a transformative experience that positively influences their attitudes and provides increased understanding and it also encourages equity for all contestants, regardless of gender, race and family education level.

These programs inspire an interest in science and encourage a sense of achievement. There were 60 students entered in the Saskatoon Science Fair and now First Nations science fairs are being held to provide this experience in settings where students previously did not have an opportunity to participate.

Peggy thanked Scott for his outstanding presentation and career and wished him much success at Harvard.
