PROGRAM

Ravvi Chibbar introduced our speaker, Raman Chawla Ph.D. Raman is the Senior Scientist for the Institute of Nuclear Medicine and Allied Sciences in New Delhi, India. His presentation today is Rural & Urban Farming in Extreme Conditions for Sustainable Agricultural Production. Raman is currently visiting family in Saskatoon so we are very fortunate that Ravi has been able to persuade Raman to speak to our club.



Many areas of the world have food security issues because of their extreme climate conditions and remote locations. India has such a location that is remote, at high elevations and has extreme climatic conditions. This is the area known as Leh & Ladakh which has a populaion of 1.5 m, is greater than 3000m above sea level and can reach temperatures of grearer than -30C. As a consequence food prices can be double or tripled in the winter time.

The Indian government has provided funding for research into solutions for this food insecurity problem. Different types of greeenhouses have been developed and different conditions. tested under Recommendations have been developed for types of greenhouses to be used to maximize production under various conditions. The results in terms of food production have been quite impressive with

2 to 15 times increase in yields for various

types of crops. There are also improvements in nutritional profile through the use of these new greenhouse technologies.

One of the goals of this program is for the area to become self sustaining in the production of vegetables. They feel that if each residence has at least one producing greenhouse this will be attainable. Currently they have 75% uptake.

These technologies can also be applied to other areas of the world with similar food security issues such as Northern Saskatchewan and the Arctic.
