# **PROGRAM**

Betty Ann introduced our speaker Zeba Ahmad.



Zeba Ahmad, a proud mom of two grown children, is a tireless volunteer locally in Saskatoon, provincially and nationally. Zeba began her professional career as a pharmacist and practiced for over 20 years, before moving on to other professional roles. She currently serves as the CEO for the Saskatoon Public Schools Foundation.

She has served on and chaired several boards including Royal University Hospital Foundation and Saskatoon Community Foundation.

For her community involvement Zeba was awarded the 2021 YWCA Woman of Distinction for Community Building and in 2023 was the recipient of the Queen Elizabeth II Platinum Jubilee Medal

The Saskatoon Public Schools Foundation (SPSF) was incorporated in 2008. Its goals are to assist the public schools in improving in the areas of literacy, wellness and innovation. Over the past several years the Foundation has raised \$17m towards the achievement of these goals. The fund raising goal is \$20m.

Studies have shown that every dollar invested in preventative programming will return \$7. A 1% increase in adult literacy could create an annual economic benefit of \$67 B for Canada. Saskatchewan currently has the third lowest rating in Canada for students reading at their level in Grade 3. Currently Saskatchewan has 5000 students annually who do not graduate on time from Grade 12. There is definitely a need for improvement.

Zeba went on to describe the programs that SPSF have promoted or funded to improve the literacy rates in Saskatoon. These include FullDay/EveryDay Kindergarten, Page Turners, Camp Brain Power and the Cheer Crate.

Zeba also pointed out that the additional annual cost of a full kindergarten program in Saskatchewan is \$4.7m. This is equal to a rounding error in the annual provincial budget.

All of this programming is aimed at helping every student reach their full potential.

Karol thanked Zeba for her presentation.
