## PROGRAM



Bill Christensen introduced our speaker, Chris MacLeod. Chris is a native of Regina who received his law degree from the University if Saskatchewan. He had a law practice in Hamilton for a number of years before moving to Toronto. During much of his working life he has been an advocate for people with cystic fibrosis and worked towards the acceptance of a highly effective treatment drug(Trikafta) to be covered by the provincial health plans.

Chris was diagnosed with Cystic Fibrosis (CF) when he was 4 years old. Life expectancy has improved from 4 years to 50 years+ due to the development of new treatments. Chris notes that Saskatchewan has always been a leader in provision of new treatments for CF patients. He said he was lucky to have been born in Saskatchewan for that reason.

Trikafta is a transformational drug that can treat up to 90% of Canadians with cystic fibrosis. It is a triple combination <u>precision medicine</u> (ivacaftor, tezacaftor and elexacaftor). Rather than just treating symptoms, Trikafta targets the basic defect from specific genetic mutations that cause CF. Chris has a rare form of CF that could be treated with initial iterations of Trikafta. He began taking the drug in 2008 and soon noticed a tremendous improvement in his general health and qualituy of life.

Seeing the effect the drug had on his own life he immediatley became an advocate for the acceptance by Health Canada of Trikafta as a treatment for CF. In June 2021 Trikafta received approval for its sale in Canada for treatment of CF. Canada was the last major country to grant this approval. By the fall of 2021 all provincial governments had approved coverage for the drug under the provincial health plans.

Trikapta is a gene modulator that costs the drug plans approximately \$100,000 per year per patient. The patient takes two pills a day, 365 days a year. The drug is still protected by the initial patent.

The acceptance and approval of this drugs use was a huge team effort involving court cases and political advocacy by many parties.
