PROGRAM

President Michael introduced our speaker, Barbara Melara. Barbara is the Chair of the Board of the Amarok Society of Canada.

Barbara holds a Master of Social Work degree, and has spent most of her career in the social service field. Her work history includes six years teaching in Belize. In Canada, she has worked with children, youth, adults and families in a variety of settings – a woman's shelter, residential settings and most recently with a Children's Aid Society where she worked mainly with First Nations people living off-reserve. She is married, and is a member of the Lion's Club of St. George, Ontario. She is active in the faith community in St. George. Amarok Society fits well with her beliefs. She sponsors the Amarok Society's Libby Women's School, named in memory and honour of her mother, Elizabeth 'Libby' Mayo.

The goal of the Amarok Society is improve the education opportunities for children who have no opportunity to acheive literacy because they live in poverty. Barbara has specific experience with the slum dwellers of Bangladesh.

The technique that the Amarok Society uses is called "Teach the Mothers". Mothers are trained to teach their children. This has been a very successful and cost effective way to improve literacy. Mothers transfer their new learnings to their children who in turn teach other children. Because of the new knowledge older children are able to obtain jobs. The income helps support the family and provides a role model for other community members to take part in the process.

The schooling takes place in the home and are referred to as micro-schools. This method of learning results in a network of teachers and learners that multiplies the effect of the initial mother who trained to become a teacher.

Students who start in the micro-school program and are then are able to attend the government operated schools become role models for their siblings and neighborhoods.

In closing Barbara invited our club to help out in this program as many other Rotary clubs have.

Peggy Clark thanked Barbara for her inpirational presentation on behalf of the club.
