PROGRAM

Dorothy introduced our speakers Jennifer Altenberg, Principal of Oskayak School and Cecile Smith, Kookum and one of the cultural leaders at the school.

Oskayak has been selected to make a presentation at the World Indigenous Peoples Conference on Education (WIPCE) in Aotearoa, New Zealand from November 10 to the 22, 2025.

Oskayak High School is located in Treaty 6 Territory and the Homeland of the Metis is proud to lead the delegation of 17 indigenous students, their families and their culture team to share our story of resilience, identity and educational and innovation. Our presentation abstract was accepted by WIPCE, an honour that places our work among the most respected in the global indigenous education realm. This is more than a trip. It's a powerful, active, cultural resurgence in youth leadership. Our students will present traditional song and dance land based learning and the strength of intergenerational knowledge it will speak to the impact of indigenous education and the healing power of culture.

An excerpt of their presentation was then performed for the club by way of drumming and dancing. Accompanied by two student drummers, student dancers in their full regalia performed the Shawl Dance and the Jingle Dance.
