Betty Ann introduced our speaker Brynn Campbell. Brynn is a former resident of Saskatoon and past member of our club. Brynn lives in northern Morocco where she is the

founder/director of AIDEZ NOUS A AIDER (ANA). ANA is an Non-Governmental Organization(NGO) that helps migrants. The NGO was founded in 2015.

Aidez nous a Aider (Help Us to Help)is committed to promoting self-reliance through a variety of entrepreneurial projects, with a specific focus on skill development for migrants in Morocco. Our mission is migrant empowerment by facilitating practical skills and enhancing the lives of marginalized communities. As a grassroots movement, we actively engage with migrants in Morocco, working collaboratively to provide them with the necessary tools and knowledge. Our goal is to establish sustainable pathways for these individuals to achieve self-sufficiency, fostering both personal growth and community improvement.

Migrants are Africans from Sudan, Congo and other Central African countries who wish to migrate to Europe. They go to Morocco because the passage to Spain is only 14 km across the strait. European countries are making the passage very difficult so migrants can spend several years in Morocco obtaining the necessary documentation.



At *Aidez Nous à Aider*, we empower undocumented migrants through skill development in digital media, art, and environmental projects. We offer training in video editing, motion graphics, and digital marketing, along with mentorship opportunities. Through our *Merch by Migrants* shoe line, designed by migrants, we also raise awareness and provide creative outlets. Our work helps migrants gain the tools they need to thrive and break the cycle of marginalization.
