- The Board is targetting January 2022 as a starting date for in-person meetings.


- The Board has formulated a racial justice statement for the club to review by seperate email this week.

### PROGRAM

Asit Sarkar introduced our speaker Tasnim Jaisee who is the President of the University of Saskatchewan Students Union (USSU). Tasnim is a past president of the Arts and Science Student Society, has been active in entrepenurial programs and is the first person from the immigrant community to become President of USSU.

Tasnim briefly outlined the USSU governance structure. USSU has a 4 member council that is the executive for the union. Each campus college sends 4 representatives to the USSU. Services to students are then provided in person or on-line.



The USSU operates and administers the following programs:

U-Pass, Health and Dental Plan, Empower Me, Campus Groups, Sustainability, Tutor & Housing Registry, Co-curricular Records and the Centres.

The USSU made the following recommendations for institutions of advanced education as follows:

1) Eliminate Saskatchewan student loan interest.

2) One year student loan repayment grace period

3) Increase scholarships, grants and bursaries for Indigenous students and International students

4) Policies to expand reviews of sexual violence peventative measures at post-secondary institutions every three years.

On behalf of the club, Lorne Braithwaite thanked Ms. Jaisee for her presentation.
